KNOW YOUR RIGHTS! *Preparation Days*



PREPARATION DAYS

There are 4 non-instructional days in the school year; 3 at the beginning of the year, 1 at the end. (For some members on longer work calendars, there may be more.)

"PRIMARILY" FOR PREPARATION

The union contract says that the 3 non-instructional days at the beginning of the school year must be primarily for teacher (and other educator) preparation activities, but can include "site operational meetings" and "site/department orientation activities."

What are site operational meetings & orientation activities?

Site operational meetings are limited to information *about site operations*, such as schedule, reviewing emergency procedures, and the site discipline plan. Orientation activities Orientation activities include introduction of staff, checking out equipment, and so on. Types of work that are <u>not</u> allowed on preparation days include:

- Professional development (except for those newly assigned to TK), and
- Activities that focus on how to do your job better, like reviewing test scores.

ENFORCING OUR RIGHTS

If an administrator violates our rights, with your school union rep, bring co-workers together to collectively decide on a solution and a plan of action.
